Before you travel

- Please ensure that your Nights Away Notification (NAN) is submitted, within the appropriate timescale, to nightsaway@blackpoolscouts.org.uk
- Please be aware that membership numbers are required to be input on the NAN for all adults attending
- Any issues, please email the shared inbox and we will contact you to resolve

Travel

- Departure will be approx 18:00, from selected pick-up points, Saturday 07:45, with return to the same points on Sunday 15:30 – will confirm asap
- Coach timetables will be issued PLEASE check and confirm numbers

Car parking on site

- If you are travelling in your own vehicle, the field adjacent to Bibby's Farm will be open
- Car-park permits are not required

Health forms and kit list

- Health Forms and a Kit List are available on the District website
- Two copies of the health form are required for each young person & adult who are staying overnight
- One copy should be handed in on arrival and will be saved in a central location

Activities

- Appropriate footwear to be worn for the water activities, not wellingtons
- Timed activities water, archery and climbing, will be provided asap – the remainder of activities are to 'turn-up' and enjoy. Some of the activities will require adult supervision.
- Adventurous Activities Permission forms – **Shooting - Cub age upwards**. Every YP requires a form – **No Form, No Shooting**. Leaders are required to handover permission forms and stay for duration of activity for those YP of Cub age. Adult support is required whilst the instructors deliver activity.
- The permission to camp form on the District website, please check that shooting and swimming are completed, as required. If another form has been used, please ensure that each young person has an appropriately signed shooting and swimming form completed

Setting up camp

- Tents can be pitched on Thursday throughout the day
- As a number of Groups are catering etc together they need to be adjacent, so will issue this info and, hopefully, a proposed pitching area for Groups
- As raised on the recent Risk Assessment call, please be mindful of other Groups



On site

- A smoking area will be signposted – the area must be used on at all times. This includes all e-cigarettes and vaping.
- This will be a dry camp. The Scout Association's Safety Policy is quite clear that when responsible for young people, adults must not drink alcohol. To support this, our Policy, Organisation and Rules 2.4, categorically states:

Adults must not consume alcohol when they are directly responsible for young people on a Scouting activity and must not permit young people (aged under 18 years) to consume alcohol on Scouting activities.
