We want to celebrate all the achievements from across the year, so had a look at a slightly different annual report. A visual journey of our year to remember.



A massive thank you to all our young people, volunteers, parents and guardians who got stuck in with code cracking, puzzle solving fun.









Mowbreck Campsite

Training

It's been a challenging year for training with considerable changes to adult training requirements and to training delivery.

The emphasis on training compliance, particularly Safeguarding and Safety has resulted in many reminders to adults to complete the on-line training, and, although some have needed a little encouragement we are almost fully trained in Safeguarding and Safety within the District. First Aid is now following a similar path.

Diane and I have played a large part in the County training programme to provide on-line sessions for nearly all 'Wood Badge' modules. This has not been easy and has

been very time consuming but has resulted in many of our adults completing modules towards their Wood Badge.

We will continue with the programme of training with face-to-face training scheduled to re-start in September. The challenge now is to validate those who have completed modules; our Training Advisers will need to play a considerable role in that task.

All adults will continue to get reminders about training but, at the end of the day, the responsibility for having training up to date rests with the adult themselves.

Appointments

In a normal year we schedule meetings at approximately 6 weekly intervals and usually see around 40 candidates over the course of the year. Meetings alternate between 1st Norbreck and 4th Blackpool HQs and we appreciate their continued support.

There were significant changes to DBS procedures to accommodate remote ID verification and from the outset we decided to deal with all renewals centrally and made maximum use of technology to facilitate ID checks.

Forgive me though a little "licence" in extending the report period by 3 months to include Quarter 1 of 2021-2022 ie the start of the recovery period.

Historically there is one other regular cause of delay in completing the appointments process and that is the provision of references. In reviewing

the use of Zoom we also reviewed the provision of references and decided that we would not interview a candidate until two references are received.

We are though just starting to see an uptake in new leaders and as of mid July we have 11 members in preprovisional roles. Work to do then before the September reopening.
